Michael has volunteered on the sidelines with the North Sydney District Rugby League Referees' Association for almost 50 years, helping to train and mentor young referees, as well as managing game days on weekends.

#### Central Sydney Senior Volunteer of the Year: Anthony Tang from Dundas Valley

Anthony has been the driving force behind many community events and programs such as the local Aussie Day Lunch, the Moon Festival, and Ryde Lunar New Year. He founded the Ryde Community Forum but has also coached local soccer and led science programs in local primary schools. His volunteering has helped to bring people from different cultures and faiths together and build better understanding, cohesion and connection.
