Jamberoo 'everywhere' volunteer named 2024 Illawarra Volunteer of the Year

Jamberoo Red Cross President and prolific community leader Barbara Adams has been named the 2024 Illawarra Volunteer of the Year for her significant contributions to countless community groups and causes.

Barbara received her Award today at Wollongong City Diggers as part of the 2024 NSW Volunteer of the Year Awards. Recipients in other Illawarra regional award categories were also announced, including young, adult, senior and volunteer team of the year.

The NSW Volunteer of the Year Awards celebrate the work of thousands of individuals and volunteer teams from a diverse range of organisations across the state.

The Awards are hosted by The Centre for Volunteering, whose mission it is to promote and support volunteering across NSW.

Illawarra Young Volunteer of the Year: Alyssa Norris from Windang

Alyssa is a passionate advocate for community safety. As Vice-Captain of the Windang Surf Life Saving Club, she actively participates in beach patrols, averaging 50 hours per season. Her enthusiasm for the club extends to attracting new members and ensuring that current members feel appreciated.

Illawarra Adult Volunteer of the Year: Krystle Morgan from Wollongong

Krystle Morgan is a board member with The Illawarra Shoalhaven Gender Alliance. As a volunteer, she helps to raise awareness of issues affecting transgender people through local events and education, ensuring that the gender-diverse and wider LGBTQIA+ communities in the area feel supported. Additionally, Krystle gives her time to assist the Make a Wish Foundation and Kookaburra Kids.

Illawarra Senior Volunteer of the Year: Barbara Adams from Jamberoo

Barbara is Jamberoo's 'everywhere' volunteer who has dedicated decades of her life to helping others and making her community a better place. Her volunteering has spanned the Jamberoo Red Cross, Jamberoo Football Club, Salvation Army Red Shield Appeal, Jamberoo Car Show & Family Day, Jamberoo Australia Day festivities, Jamberoo's Christmas decorations, and the Kemblawarra Public School P&C.

About the NSW Volunteer of the Year Awards

2024 marks the 18th year of these high-profile Awards, which have honoured hundreds of thousands of volunteers for their community service, while highlighting the value and benefits of volunteering.

Anyone who volunteers in NSW can be nominated for an award.

The Award categories are:

- Young Volunteer of the Year
- Adult Volunteer of the Year
- Senior Volunteer of the Year
- Volunteer Team of the Year
- Employee Volunteer of the Year
- Club Volunteer of the Year
- Not-for-Profit Voluntary Governance Award
- Volunteer Leader of the Year

Twenty-five regional ceremonies are held in towns and suburbs throughout NSW from mid-August until November.

The regional finalists will be invited to a Gala State ceremony in December in Sydney where the NSW Volunteer of Year is announced. Recipients for the NSW Volunteer of the Year are also announced across the eight categories.
